As noted in the last issue of the New York Alpha News, your alumni association board is continuing to work on things that we control and that will enhance our case for recolonization when

the time comes. The facilities committee continues to look for a feasible approach for transforming the basement to create a welcoming gathering space and recreation area. This is not an easy task in the face of high construction costs and limited funds. But the committee is determined, and I am confident it will find a way.

Work is continuing to develop a robust model for advising a new colony and, eventually, an active undergraduate chapter. The efforts to find and deploy other best practices will increase as we approach the submittal of the next application. I continue to believe that these efforts will significantly strengthen our next application.

As noted previously, we continue to have productive dialogue at multiple levels in the university administration. Our message has consistently been that we want to create a model chapter and be part of the effort to improve the Greek system at Cornell.

Meanwhile, SAE National continues to demonstrate that it is serious about adherence to its standards for behavior. A key part of rebuilding the SAE brand has been National's commitment to closing chapters for health and safety violations or behavioral concerns. It is a difficult decision to close a chapter, but when the wellbeing of brothers is compromised, it is necessary to

act decisively and consistently, sending a clear message in the process.

Your alumni association board recently unanimously approved the creation of the George Desdunes Memorial Fund. The fund's Alumni can make tax-deductible donations to Cornell designated for the Hillcrest SAE Development Fund. The first investment by the fund will be to sponsor the keynote at the annual AD White Greek Summit in


mission is "to honor the memory of George Desdunes '13 by investing in educational programs aimed at preventing the circumstances that led to his death." The operative concepts in this mission are prevention and education. The intent is to provide educational

programs that help students recognize risks and take appropriate action when faced with potentially dangerous situations.

Both Cornell and SAF National feature education as part of their recently announced reforms. Our intent is to find ways to complement these programs without duplicating them. The board's fundraising committee will be tasked

with finding suitable programs and recommending them to the full board for approval. Funding will come from the Hillcrest SAE Development Fund, which also funds capital improvements to Hillcrest.

Facilities Report: Upgrades, Improvements Underway and on the Horizon

Our main progress at Hillcrest this year has been installation of the radon mitigation system and some work in the kitchen. The radon project was necessary because after testing it was determined there was a problem in the basement. Accordingly, a system was installed to blow air out of the basement area into the atmosphere above the roof. It is a fairly common problem around Ithaca. Fortunately, the solution was pretty straightforward and not too expensive.

In the kitchen, new lighting was installed, and the step under the stove was

floor was also installed in the walk-in.

We continue to work on ideas for the rec room project, but no timetable has been agreed on at this point. We are looking into using Ardex as the flooring in the rec room. It is a self-leveling floor compound that's substantially cheaper than tile. It would have a slightly institutional/industrial look, and is not as fancy as tile, but its lack of seams and grout would be good for cleanup—something our next generation of house managers would appreciate. It can also be tiled over in the future if we determine that we want another


